

Session WN1NOV2018 Feedback comment
written July 24, 2022

The session was done on November 4, 2018.

In July 2022 I was editing the session video and preparing the session files for upload. This was when in July 2022 I did an internet search on the first out of the four news predictions covered in the session, the one predicting a dark unmarked military airplane that goes down into the sea, to find out if there would be confirmation for this news prediction.

I can no longer remember whether I initially accidentally wrote "November 2021" in the internet search field together with search words for the airplane, or whether I initially correctly wrote "November 2018" together with search words for the airplane as it should be, however the printscreen copies of the internet search findings about an airplane has "November 2021" in the search field: this is either because I accidentally wrote "2021" from the start while intending to write "2018", or otherwise it is because I initially wrote "2018" and found the news and later after a moment wanted to find the news again and did not find it on a new similar or same internet search and then wrote "2021" for whatever reason which then located the news story again.

In any case, the news story that did come up, whether I initially wrote "2018" or "2021" with the search words, relates to a story about a military airplane which went down into the sea. It is for the month of November, but it is for the year 2021 and not for the year 2018. One thing I am entirely sure of however, is that when I initially saw this news story from the internet search, I did not initially notice that it was for the year 2021 and not for the year 2018, and my reaction was to be excited to assume this to be a match. This news story correlates strongly to the news prediction I had in the session, only the year is wrong. Since I did not at first notice that the year was 2021 instead of 2018 in the internet search results (since I probably searched for 2018 and would have assumed news only for 2018 to show up and not for other years) I embraced it as a correlation, which I presume then strongly turned that into a feedback. So it is presumably the case of a strange feedback loop, containing an internet search mistake with the years.

I presume that in July 2022, I sent myself from November 2018, to go to the news event that took place in November 2021. Even though I had intended back in November 2018, to only go to news that would happen in November 2018.

So it seems one of those funny cases of feedback loops where the feedback loop eats itself.

As for the other three news predictions covered in this session. I did some internet searches in July 2022 for any matching news for the treasure restored from the sea onto a ship for November 2018 and did not find any match. I do not recall if I did any internet searches for news story 3 with the demonstration march, or for news story 4 with the royal baby, as by then it seemed to me wrong to

search for the news that was predicted, instead one would more ideally look up a page with the main news for a month (open ended question) and to make that into a feedback.
